

High hopes, dashed like a dropped nickel plated Colt onto a pile of granite gravel. But, then I cocked it again and realized the

truth ... it really was that smooth. I felt so little resistance because there was, indeed, so little resistance. The words "buttery-smooth" came into my mind as I cocked the hammer yet again, since I had no ability to resist the urge. Again and again ... and again, over and over I did it. This couldn't be true, but it was. I had the truth in my hand. Eddie really was that good at it. I was hopelessly hooked, sold entirely, and within the day had the rest of my Colts packed and shipped.

Those of you not familiar with Peacemaker Specialists are in for a treat. Known throughout the world as one of the premier Colt magicians, Eddie Janis, sole owner, proprietor, and gunsmith

of said establishment, works his magic on Colt single action revolvers and no others. Terms like "fastidious" and "nitpicking" are not at all out of line when you talk of Eddie's devotion to his craft. His workmanship is absolutely the best possible. Period. End of story. There is no second place here. As Yoda, of Star Wars fame told Luke Skywalker: "Do, or do not ... there is no try." Eddie does.

Eddie is noted for his action jobs, but offers cosmetic makeovers of old and new guns (antiquing), matching new parts to old parts, case coloring indistinguishable from Colt's own, remarking to match firstgeneration guns, beveling cylinders and more are all part and parcel of what's available. Engraving is available and only limited by your checkbook. Fancy stocks made to your heart's whim from ivory to exotic woods, horn, pearl, and the sky's the limit is a phone call away. Beautiful stuff. I've seen it.

Eddie's extensive personal historical knowledge means all detail work is correct for the gun in question. You won't see any bits and pieces that don't belong together. Got an old "beater" lying around? Grandpa's old

hogleg rusting quietly away in a drawer? Drag it out, send it to Eddie, and let him talk to you about possibilities. You'll find out what's right ... and what's wrong ... about that old gun and the best part of all, you can easily bring it back to life.

Peacemaker Specialists is recommended by the Colt factory and the custom shop for work and a recommendation doesn't hardly get any better than that. Peacemaker Specialists is a parts distributor and offers a line of Peacemaker Parts for all Model P guns. Peacemaker Parts manufactures many out of production Colt parts and maintains a large inventory of both new and used Colt parts. If you need it, they either have it, it isn't available, or they never made it (like a Bisley spur on a single action hammer!).

Eddie's one-man shop means turnaround time is sometimes slow, but a bad job that's done quickly isn't worth the money, no matter how little (or much) you spent. A little patience always pays off in solid gold. I know the man personally and don't lightly make this recommendation. But, you have it from me, or my name isn't Rattlesnake Roy. A.
